As a Parish Community, we commit to contribute generously & regularly to sustain the life and ministries at Trinity Hamburg.

Thank you for your contribution of \$4,179.51 in last week's Pledge and Plate – a \$582.07 shortfall of our weekly budget.

As of this morning, we have reduced our \$32,000 shortfall to \$25,637.00, but we will not be able to meet *any* of our Parish expenses by November 2014 – Parish programs, utilities, general maintenance, Diocesan Tithe or Rector and staff salaries.

Thank you to those who have generously submitted a revised 2014 Pledge. To those of you who have not yet reexamined your current financial commitment to Trinity, we look forward to hearing from you in the next few weeks. Together we can meet and exceed our 2014 operating budget.

We simply must make the decision – individually and collectively - to increase our giving in 2014 and in subsequent years if we are to maintain our current staff, program and worship structures.
